Why We Play

Christian Brothers College High School prepares students from all backgrounds for success in college and for lives of leadership and service. Our Athletic Department plays a critical role in that mission by teaching the value of teamwork and commitment; setting high standards for character and accountability; and building bonds of brotherhood that our young men will carry with them throughout the rest of their lives.

CBC ATHLETIC AND ACTIVITIES “CODE OF CONDUCT”

- As a member of the Missouri State High School Activities Association, Christian Brothers College High School adheres to the belief that participation in co-curricular activities is a privilege.
- It is the philosophy of MSHSAA and its member schools that students should be encouraged and supported in their efforts to develop and maintain a chemical-free lifestyle.

Definition of Offense

- An offense shall consist of a student possessing, using, consuming, and/or being under the influence of alcohol, tobacco, or mind-altering drugs
- or if the student-athlete provides and/or encourages such substance abuse to other students. There is no minimum amount of substance to warrant an offense
- The Code of Conduct is in effect 365 days per year

For the first offense...

Suspension of 365 days from any and all sports or fine arts competitions or performances for 25% of competitions during a season. Students may still practice with teams/groups. There are three recognized sports seasons; fall, winter and spring. The entire school year is the length of a fine arts season.

- Example: A student violates the Code of Conduct agreement during a fall sport season. That student may still practice with the team/group but would miss the next 25% of that team/groups competitive games or performances. If that student plays or partakes in a winter and/or spring sport or activity, the student may try-out if applicable and practice but will miss the first 25% of that teams/groups competitive games or performances.

Self-Reporting

- ◎ Students who self-report a violation can reduce the suspension to 10%. The 10% suspension also applies to all seasons for a 365 day period.
- ◎ Must self-report to the Dean of Students immediately after the violation occurs

For the second offense

- Suspension from all athletic and fine arts competition for a 365 day period.
 - Students may still try-out and practice with teams or groups during that term but will not compete.
- For the **third offense**. . .
 - Students will not participate either competitively or in practice for any athletic or fine arts programs for the duration of their CBC career.

Eligibility

- Students on Academic Probation at CBC may not compete OR practice
- MSHSAA puts many more regulations on the sports they regulate

MSHSAA Regulations

- For starters look on the web through a link on our web site.
- Same Sport – Same Season.... You can't play for a select team during your sport season
- Different Sport – Different Season.... You can't play for a select team at the expense of a MSHSAA team (can't miss a football game to go to a fall basketball tournament)
- Sportsmanship – Get ejected in a game = miss the next one

SHOULD I EXPECT A COLLEGE ATHLETIC SCHOLARSHIP



- **The NCAA's 1,265 member** colleges and universities report that they have more than **355,000 student-athletes** playing each year. Of that 355,000 approximately 36% of these NCAA student-athletes receive a share of the \$1 billion earmarked for **athletic scholarships**. Since these figures include both male and female, and Title IX requires colleges to be absolutely even between the two genders, we can say that about 18% of all the males **playing sports in college receive some kind of athletic aid award.**

And remember, of these students **ONLY 18% ARE RECEIVING AN ATHLETIC SCHOLARSHIP**

How to prepare for College



Junior Year

- Carefully (and strategically!) choose courses
- Take ACT/SAT and report score to the Eligibility Center (Code: 9999)
- All ACT/SAT must be sent directly to the Eligibility Center from the testing agency (NCAA Bylaw 14.3.1.3.4)
- Register with the Eligibility Center at eligibilitycenter.org (\$65)
- Submit an official 6th semester transcript to the Eligibility Center

Senior Year

- Course selection is critical!!
- Retake ACT/SAT, if necessary, and submit score to the Eligibility Center

What's the “Eligibility Center”?



- That simply means register through the NCAA Clearing House.
- We have a direct link to the Clearing House through our web site under the tab “Parent Resources”
- Also, right above the Clearing House link is an NCAA publication for college bound student-athletes
